

Equifax Security Breach

Equifax announced a cybersecurity breach potentially impacting 143 million US consumers. According to the investigation by Equifax, the criminals had unauthorized access to their system beginning mid-May through July 2017. The information accessed includes names, social security numbers, dates of birth, addresses, and in some instances, driver's license numbers.

Equifax has established a dedicated website to help consumers determine if their information was included: www.equifaxsecurity2017.com. This site also allows consumers to sign up for free credit monitoring and identity theft protection.
